

Kevin Williamson, a member of the Greater St. Louis Area Council Boy Scouts of America, Troop 314 in Webster Grove, spent most of the month of June transforming the Birthday Room at ECH Every Child's Hope. What was once a crowded space in the basement of the ECH Treatment Center, the Birthday Room is now neatly organized into two accessible rooms for kids and staff to enjoy.

The Birthday Room has always been a favorite spot for children to come and select a special gift on their Birthday. Prior to Kevin's Eagle project, the donated gifts for the room were thrown together and stored in a large, unattractive storage room with many other items.

Kevin thoughtfully saw the space, developed a plan, submitted it for review and then went to work. He built shelves along the walls of the storage room and organized items by age, gender and type. He then designed a second un-used adjoining room as a place for the kids to "shop" for their gift. A fresh coat of sunny yellow paint, colorful window treatments and new shelves and racks transformed the former bland room to display the most sought after items for the children to come and "shop" for on their Birthday.

A DONATION OF HOPE AND SMILES

Early this summer, the dental care team at Ballwin Dental Care donated more than \$13,000 in dental services to 15 youth at ECH Every Child's Hope. For many of the youth, this was their first time in the dentist's chair. Anxious but excited these youth received comprehensive dental treatments which included dental exams, cleanings, x-rays, other dental procedures, and a healthy lunch.

For one young man in the St. Louis Steppingstone program, the trip to Ballwin resulted in a wider smile and brighter outlook for his future. 17-year-old David had never been to the dentist before, but instead of nerves and fear, David showed excitement, hoping his time in the dentist's chair would repair his broken front tooth. He wanted to be able to smile again and to look professional at job interviews. He was looking for confidence. When it came time for his appointment, he was not disappointed. The staff at Ballwin Dental Care performed a root canal and repaired the tooth, and David left the dental office with new hope for his future, smiling wide and knowing he would be able to find a job.

Ballwin Dental Care participates in Dentistry from the Heart, a national non-profit dedicated to providing free dental care to those in need. Each year, dental offices that participate in Dentistry from the Heart open their doors to the public to receive free cleanings. This year, Ballwin Dental Care wanted a more direct

approach, so they decided to donate the day to serving the youth in the programs at ECH. The goal was to give complete dental service to a smaller, more concentrated group. Here at ECH, we're glad that Ballwin Dental Care selected our kids for this act of kindness.

Changes happen every day. At ECH, we experience change constantly, kids coming and going...changes in state support and placement of kids.

> Due to the needs of the children in our care, ECH has had to make some recent changes. We had to convert our Open Units to Safe Intensive Units. Now, instead of having two Safe Intensive Units on campus, we will have four.

This change was necessary for many reasons. One, the children that are coming into care today need more help, restrictions and therapy than our Open Units provided. Therefore, we needed to expand our level of care to help

these young people. Secondly, the reimbursement rate for children in our Open Units did not cover the cost of serving these children and enrollment was down, creating a large deficit.

The good news is the children in our Open Units have been able to transition into our Group Homes or into foster care, paving the way for more children with greater needs.

While change is sometimes unsettling I am pleased and excited that we are going to be able to continue to provide high quality residential treatment to children and youth that require our support and expertise. I firmly believe that this is the right decision strategically, financially and ethically for the long term well being of the children in our care and our employees. Finally, this transition will not result in the loss of any ECH jobs.

STATE OF MISSOURI INCOME TAX CREDITS AVAILABLE!

Every Child's Hope has been awarded a grant from the Missouri Department of Economic Development enabling us to offer state tax credits to eligible donors under two different programs:

YOP: Anyone with a Missouri Tax liability making a donation of \$500 or more. Gifts of Cash and Stock are eligible. This is a new grant that we were thrilled to get. Plenty of YOP credits are currently available.

NAP: Any donor with a Missouri Tax Liability related to a business income. This includes LLCs, rental property, etc. Gifts of cash or stock of \$500 or more qualify for NAP. NAP credits are limited, so act soon!

How much is the tax credit worth? The tax credit is worth 50% of your YOP or NAP donation. For example, a donation of \$500 would equal a \$250 tax credit. Plus your regular federal and state tax deductions apply for the entire \$500 donation. Credits can be carried over five years.

How do I apply? Just designate your donation of \$500 or more when you mail it in as a YOP or NAP contribution.

will expand the school's. Current Read 180 program to include the Read 180 REAL JOBS library.



The students in the school struggle with academic and behavioral issues that prevent success in traditional classrooms and put them at risk of dropping out of high school. For many, the ECH School is their last chance for success.

Read 180 program improves reading achievement of struggling readers. Each student receives individualized instruction and is able to improve at his

or her own speed, which eliminates the feeling of falling behind the class. As students increase in skill, they read increasingly more difficult text until they read at the appropriate grade level and are able to understand what they read.

The Read 180 REAL JOBS library from Scholastic will help students at the ECH School improve their reading while helping them plan for the future by readying them for college and careers. The library includes 90 books that discuss 21 jobs, give a behind the scenes look at different occupations and profile successful people with interesting jobs. These resources will help our students learn to be successful while increasing their reading skills.

The Dollar General Literacy Foundation's Youth Literacy grants are awarded to assist with implementing new or expanding existing youth literacy programs. In August, the Dollar General Literacy Foundation awarded grants totaling



more than \$2 million to 564 non-profit organizations, community groups, schools and libraries throughout the United States. It is estimated that approximately 315,000 youth will be served as a result of these grants.

EATING **HEALTHY**

Mind, Body and Spirit...that is what staff work on with all the young people at ECH. With that in mind, this summer staff decided to start talking to the kids about healthy eating.

In one of the boys houses, the kids love watching cooking shows. As the kids watch these shows, they are introduced to different cuisines and cultures. Noticing this, our staff decided to build upon this interest and teach the boys all about foods by bringing in different vegetables, fruits, nuts and spices.

Today, the boys are learning to cook using different combinations of foods and spices. "What they really

enjoy is having a say so in what they eat and trying new foods even if they don't like the taste or texture," explains Randy Schneider, Supervisor for House 6. "It helps give the boys something to work toward too. I have incorporated special dining outings for those who have earned it and express an interest."

The boys have been to Whole Foods and eaten at

an Indian and Nepalese restaurant. It has also given them dining experiences that many children in care have not received before, including how to use a napkin, silverware, review a menu, order and ask questions based on their food selection.



In one of our girls houses, the girls have begun craving a healthier menu. Ms. Shay, one of the house staff, brings in new things daily for the girls to try and the girls can't wait to see what it will be. Then, the girls take turns picking what they would like to try to make and eat. Everyone then works together making the dish. "Cooking together is very

therapeutic for the girls," explains Ms. Shav. "It helps with social skills and educationally as well. Some of the girls have even taken their cooking skills back home and made healthy meals on family visits."

The girls have also planted a

garden. They took pride in watering the garden and pulling the weeks. They wanted to make such things as fresh salsa and zucchini bread. More important for these girls, however, is they are learning to make healthier choices and are feeling better about themselves.
