
"When I notice that a student is having a hard time, I take them out of the classroom and have them color a new fish," explained Ms. Candus. "The student and I get on the floor and we color, cut out the fish and place it in the aquarium. It gives the kids a chance to calm down in a positive way and it gives them one-on-one time with someone."

Many times the kids just need to know that someone is listening and cares about them. Ms. Candus has found a way to give the students what they need and, at the same time, to show them a sense of accomplishment and pride in their surroundings.

PROVIDING INDIVIDUALIZED TREATMENT WITH THE BRADLEY CARD

Working with the young people in residential treatment at ECH can be difficult. Each kid deals with his or her unique issues in a unique way. To help staff understand each young person, Sean Bradley, a therapist at ECH, created what has become known as the Bradley Card. The Bradley Card is essentially a treatment "cheat sheet" for communicating important information about a kid's treatment needs and trauma history to their direct care staff. The card allows staff to conveniently have the information necessary for providing the children with the individualized, trauma-informed care that they need.

"I thought it would be useful for the direct care 'house staff' to have a reminder of each of the kids' special needs, background, trauma history and some effective coping skills that work for each kiddo," explains Mr. Bradley. "For example, if a kid has a trauma history of being locked in a dark room, they might be afraid of the dark and require some special program or one-on-one intervention to help them feel safer at bedtime when they need to turn the lights off."

A lot of times direct care staff from certain cottages will fill in at other cottages where they might not be as familiar with the kids. With the help of the Bradley Cards, any staff person who walks in to any cottage around campus should be able to quickly read through a summary of each kid's trauma history, possible triggers, successful coping skills and strengths of that child. They will also know who the important people are for each youth, whether it's a therapist, care manager, legal guardian, or other family members or supports.

Julie was 16 when she was placed in residential treatment at ECH, after spending the past six years in numerous foster homes, residential treatment centers, and hospitals. The referral information on Julie's family background was sparse, but the history indicated that her mother abandoned her. It seemed Julie would benefit from the Family Finding program, so Amy, our Family Finding Coordinator, began to research family members for Julie. Amy found an older brother, Will, and set up a phone call between him and Julie.

During the call, Will was able to explain why they had gotten separated: he was in the Army and when he came home on leave, he realized that something was wrong with their mom. She was hospitalized and they learned that she was suffering from an undiagnosed mental health condition and dementia. The rest of the family did not realize what was happening with their mom and Julie was left to handle it all on her own. Will reassured her that her mother had always loved her, but became

sick. Mom's deteriorating condition changed her personality and caused her to do and say things that she would not have done in the past. Will provided Julie the reassurance that she was loved and that her mom was not able to be her mom- which is a much different scenario than the one where her mom didn't care for her and didn't want her anymore.

Will told Julie that he had never forgotten about her and even kept her baby pictures, past art projects and the books she used to write. He told how he had always hoped that he would get to see her again and give these back to her.

Since that first phone call, Julie has been able to visit with her brother and even visit her mom, who is terminally ill and expected to pass away soon. If it hadn't been for Family Finding, Julie would have likely never seen her family again and may have never known the truth about why she was placed in foster care.



Several years ago Leigha Gaston was looking for an "adopt-a-family" type of program for Christmas donations. She figured young kids were the neediest, so she Googled "orphanages in St. Louis." And that's the beginning of a wonderful partnership between Leigha's company and the Foster Care Case Management program at ECH. For the past five years, Leigha has connected with the program director right after Halloween and receives a Wish List for each child in foster care. She posts the list in the main area in the coworking building where she works. She also goes around to each office and explains about ECH and shares a few stories of the kids who will be receiving the presents. Every year the donations grow, along with the enthusiasm of the donors. "People want to give, but they don't always have an outlet," Leigha explains. She reminds people how much they have and encourages them to give back. "These kids have nothing, and that's not fair," she says. "We owe it to each other to help one another out. And you get better as your community gets better."

It's become a big event for her family, including her husband and 9-year-old daughter, who come with her to the wrap party her office hosts before they drop off all of the presents at ECH. It's also become a unifying event for her office. Because they are all individuals who are just renting office space (most of them start-ups), there isn't a lot of reason to interact. But collecting the gifts unites the building under a positive experience, Leigha explains. Workers congregate around the wall where the Wish List is posted and eagerly watch as the pile of presents grows each week.

Leigha tells one story of a guy in her office who goes above and beyond to provide gifts to make sure the foster care kids have a Merry Christmas. Instead of exchanging gifts with his wife, they buy gifts for ECH instead. Last year he was shopping for a family of boys, and the oldest one wanted a watch. This generous man donated his personal watch, which he had custom-made for a sailing trip he took. Besides being an expensive item, it also had sentimental value. But he decided to bless someone else with it instead. He even included a note with the watch, which said "I hope this watch guides you just as it did me."

OVERCOMING THROUGH OUTPATIENT SYCH

Did you know that ECH offers free Psychiatry Services Outpatient (OPS) to any child from age four to 19 who lives in St. Louis County? Thanks to a grant from the St. Louis Children's Service Fund, children can receive an assessment, treatment plan, and medication management by a board-certified child psychiatrist. Here's a recent story from our OPS team that demonstrates the powerful impact of this program.

Dan is a 15-year-old male who was every parent's dream. He had straight As, went a prestigious school, excelled at sports, and was very goodnatured. When he first came to ECH Outpatient Psychiatry Services, he'd been dealing with gradually worsening depression with psychotic features over the past two years. For Dan and his parents, the last two years had been a nightmare with multiple hospitalizations and at least one night in juvenile hold for aggression toward family members. Dan chronically battled suicidal thoughts because he went from being such a high-achieving young man to someone who was unable to function and who was constantly tortured by his thoughts. His anxiety was so severe that he could not walk into any public place.

Dan began seeing a psychiatrist at ECH and started making progress. He became more stable, with less hallucinations, less paranoid delusions, and less anxiety. It took some time but Dan is doing far better than anyone ever imagined. He is finishing high school, taking college classes, and establishing a social life. He hopes one day to become a therapist or counselor. His doctor believes this is something he definitely is capable of doing.
