The scholarship assists students "who have faced and overcome great obstacles in their young lives." She is also being considered for a scholarship from Yale.

Mary plans to obtain a dual-engineering degree of physics and mechanical engineering, to help her pursue her interests of robotics and computer-aided design. She hopes to use her love of engineering and physics to be a skilled inventor and entrepreneur. "The Steppingstone program has allowed me to have a place to sleep while teaching me life skills useful when I'm off on my own," Mary says. "Steppingstone also helps pay for a lot of important essentials, such as school supplies or a birth certificate. Steppingstone is exactly what it sounds like—a stepping stone. The resources are available to reach your goals, whether that be to finish a four-year degree or afford your own home."

# A BROTHER'S REASSURANCE THROUGH FAMILY FINDING

Julie was 16 when she was placed in residential treatment at ECH, after spending the past six years in numerous foster homes, residential treatment centers, and hospitals. The referral information on Julie's family background was sparse, but the history indicated that her mother abandoned her. It seemed Julie would benefit from the Family Finding program, so Amy, our Family Finding Coordinator, began to research family members for Julie. Amy found an older brother, Will, and set up a phone call between him and Julie.

During the call, Will was able to explain why they had gotten separated: he was in the Army and when he came home on leave, he realized that something was wrong with their mom. She was hospitalized and they learned that she was suffering from an undiagnosed mental health condition and dementia. The rest of the family did not realize what was happening with their mom and Julie was left to handle it all on her own. Will reassured her that her mother had always loved her, but became

sick. Mom's deteriorating condition changed her personality and caused her to do and say things that she would not have done in the past. Will provided Julie the reassurance that she was loved and that her mom was not able to be her mom- which is a much different scenario than the one where her mom didn't care for her and didn't want her anymore.

Will told Julie that he had never forgotten about her and even kept her baby pictures, past art projects and the books she used to write. He told how he had always hoped that he would get to see her again and give these back to her.

Since that first phone call, Julie has been able to visit with her brother and even visit her mom, who is terminally ill and expected to pass away soon. If it hadn't been for Family Finding, Julie would have likely never seen her family again and may have never known the truth about why she was placed in foster care.

The new 2017 YOP tax credits will apply to donations of \$500 or more received between January 1, 2017 and December 31, 2017 and are available to any individual, business, or corporation paying taxes in the State of Missouri.




# UNITY THROUGH G I V I N G

Several years ago Leigha Gaston was looking for an "adopt-a-family" type of program for Christmas donations. She figured young kids were the neediest, so she Googled "orphanages in St. Louis." And that's the beginning of a wonderful partnership between Leigha's company and the Foster Care Case Management program at ECH. For the past five years, Leigha has connected with the program director right after Halloween and receives a Wish List for each child in foster care. She posts the list in the main area in the coworking building where she works. She also goes around to each office and explains about ECH and shares a few stories of the kids who will be receiving the presents. Every year the donations grow, along with the enthusiasm of the donors. "People want to give, but they don't always have an outlet," Leigha explains. She reminds people how much they have and encourages them to give back. "These kids have nothing, and that's not fair," she says. "We owe it to each other to help one another out. And you get better as your community gets better."

It's become a big event for her family, including her husband and 9-year-old daughter, who come with her to the wrap party her office hosts before they drop off all of the presents at ECH. It's also become a unifying event for her office. Because they are all individuals who are just renting office space (most of them start-ups), there isn't a lot of reason to interact. But collecting the gifts unites the building under a positive experience, Leigha explains. Workers congregate around the wall where the Wish List is posted and eagerly watch as the pile of presents grows each week.

Leigha tells one story of a guy in her office who goes above and beyond to provide gifts to make sure the foster care kids have a Merry Christmas. Instead of exchanging gifts with his wife, they buy gifts for ECH instead. Last year he was shopping for a family of boys, and the oldest one wanted a watch. This generous man donated his personal watch, which he had custom-made for a sailing trip he took. Besides being an expensive item, it also had sentimental value. But he decided to bless someone else with it instead. He even included a note with the watch, which said "I hope this watch guides you just as it did me."

# A POCKET FULL OF PRAYERS

Put it on a table and use it as a coaster, remembering someone thought of you as they made those stitches. With just a touch of the hand, you'll feel it and be reminded of those ladies who prayed for you while knitting and continue to pray for you today."



# PECISION MO VOTERS MUST DECIDE ON NEW TAX Autoplay: On 0222 (1) CC 12

## FOR JACKSON COUNTY YOUTH

November 8, voters in Kansas City passed the Children's Services Fund initiative in Jackson County with approximately 167,000 (59%) votes! This 1/8 cent sales tax will fund agencies such as Steppingstone, to offer a variety of services to children and youth in need. The Children's Service Fund Coalition estimates that for every \$1 invested in prevention, Jackson County will save \$11 that would have been spent on substance abuse treatment, lost wages, and criminal justice costs. The Coalition estimates that \$15 million will be available to help kids and families.

Steppingstone Director Lynn Durbin was heavily invested in helping this initiative pass. He was on the executive committee of the Children's Services Fund Coalition, serving as treasurer. He also was part of the community education efforts related to the fund, including petition signature gathering to place the initiative on the ballot, fund raising for the coalition, polling, advocacy, media appearances, yard sign placements and working at polling sites on election day.

According to Lynn, the needs of at-risk children and youth in the Kansas City metropolitan area are clear and compelling. There are significant gaps in services for older youth struggling with homelessness, substance abuse, early pregnancy



and mental health issues. Steppingstone seeks to build upon our already existing transitional living program which supports at-risk youth move towards successful independent living and self-sufficiency. Steppingstone is prepared to lead the way in narrowing the service gap for at-risk families, older youth and children in Jackson County in collaboration with the Children's Service's Fund.
