## **Residential Treatment Program** and Educational Services

Children have been learning and healing on the ECH main campus since the mid-1860s. Today, it is home to our Residential Treatment Program as well as the ECH School and Early Education Center.

Residential Treatment provides a safe, full-time space for youth as they work to overcome years of significant abuse or trauma. We gather a team of professionals who wrap them in care—providing consistency and routine—and then help them build the resilience they'll need to be successful, no matter where life takes them.

Our Educational Services offer learning opportunities from the cradle to the cap and gown, creating a one-on-one relationship with each child that reveals their unique strengths. We develop customized learning plans that combine top-notch education with expert social-emotional care.

"We recently helped three children who had been removed from an unsafe home and needed immediate placement: two boys ages 9 and 6 along with their 4-year-old sister, whom they fretted over and called 'baby girl.'

The small but strong Family Connections team swung into action across all departments. Our mental health staff provided a gentle and soothing space for the children to process the situation, foster care staff called family members and foster homes that might be a good fit, and case workers took them to Urgent Care so their medical needs could be met.

Even other departments within the ECH organization stepped up! Residential Treatment found clothes and showers for the children. The maintenance staff got involved, making sure our buildings stayed open after 5 pm.

I had such a great feeling about ECH during all this. Not only did our Family Connections team rally, but the entire agency jumped right in where needed. I am so proud to be part of an organization that cares so much about the clients we serve."

## **Family Connections**

Nearly all families deal with a difficult period at one time or another. It's never a mistake or a failure to ask for help, but rather an opportunity to take a huge step forward. Our ECH team stands with families at these moments with three programs: Family Solutions for Kids in-home therapy, Foster Care Case Management, and Outpatient Psychiatric Services.

Our highest goal is to offer understanding where there is confusion, comfort where there is unease, and growth when there is adversity.

## **Hope Lights** the Path Ahead

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"This is the second time I've been at Steppingstone. The first time I just wasn't ready and I left after one month. I've been back for over a year now.

I have been diagnosed with PTSD, bipolar disorder, and personality disorder. I didn't want to meet with my psychiatrist or take my medicines because they made me not feel right, but I also didn't fit at school and couldn't keep a job. I didn't have anyone to talk to and help me figure things out. I felt trapped.

My medical case manager helped me schedule and keep my appointments and figure out how to take my medicines. I was able to move from the female group living home to one of ECH's off-campus apartments. I have been finishing my GED, have had a job for 6 months, and would like to get a driver's permit.

I want to be independent. I want to live in my own place and have my own car. I've been able to see what I need to do to make that happen. I'm so glad ECH didn't give up on me."

ECH's Steppingstone programs in St. Louis and Kansas City are there for youth ages 16-22 who are exiting the foster care system, experiencing homelessness, or who find themselves "on their own" for a variety of reasons. We offer stability and a team of experienced, trustworthy partners as they navigate life's choices. We empower them as they work toward personal goals, build skills, and learn how to care for their own mental and physical health.

Our ultimate goal is to provide the tools youth need to successfully transition into a life they want and deserve.

81% of youth are discharged into a less restricted setting




